



## **SEXUAL VIOLENCE**

This section asks about non-consensual or unwanted sexual contact you may have experienced. The person with whom you had unwanted sexual contact could have been a stranger or someone you know, such as a family member, a dating or romantic partner, or another student. These questions ask about five types of sexual contact:

- touching of a sexual nature
- oral sex
- sexual intercourse
- anal sex
- sexual penetration with a finger or object

We would like to learn more about situations when students have experienced non-consensual or unwanted sexual contact in order to help prevent these incidents and support students better. We understand that these can be very sensitive issues for students, and resources will be provided at the end of the survey.

The questions below ask about non-consensual or unwanted sexual contact that involved force or threats of force against you. Force could include someone holding you down with their body weight, pinning your arms, hitting or kicking you, or using or threatening to use a weapon against you.







## STALKING AND RELATIONSHIP VIOLENCE

This section asks questions about experiences you might have had in romantic or intimate relationships and other forms of social contact (from strangers, friends, relatives, spouses, and/or partners) since you became a student at Fairfield. Please do not refer to relationships or contact prior to your time at Fairfield.

Stalking can be defined as: A course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel fear. Stalking involves repeated and continued harassment made against the expressed or reasonably implied wishes of another individual, which causes the targeted individual to feel emotional distress, including fear and apprehension. Stalking behaviors may include: pursuing or following; non-consensual (unwanted) communication or contact including face-to-face, telephone calls, voice messages, electronic messages, web-based messages, text messages, unwanted gifts, etc.; trespassing; and surveillance or other types of observation


