## SEXUAL VIOLENCE

This section asks about non-consensual or unwanted sexual contact you may have experienced. These questions ask about five types of sexual contact:

- touching of a sexual nature
- oral sex
- sexual intercourse
- anal sex
- sexual penetration with a finger or object
