Trend Analysis	<i>Utilizing the CCS-R dispositions cut off at 44/55, we noticed that at Point I the program is not meeting the 80% at or above target range set as a goal. Upon further analysis of the CCS-R, it is evident that some of the faculty are indicating “did not observe” which provides 0 points which confounds the score interpretation. We will need to train each faculty member teaching the course to provide evaluation on each aspect without utilizing the “did not observe” option.</i>

Compact Legislation Work

- CCA was considering joining the Counseling Compact (an interstate agreement for privilege to practice in other states through telemental health (TMH)). Since this was my (Dr. Novella's) area of research (TMH), I wanted to be involved in these conversations about this bill. I participated in the following:
